
























We have the highest expectations

Our outstanding curriculum and happy, stimulating environment are backed up by consistency and a continuous focus on achievement for all. Standards of attainment are amongst the very highest both in Cheshire and Nationally.

Not only are our academic results consistently high – our SATS grades regularly put us amongst the top schools both locally and nationally.

Learning is inspiring, challenging and fun. Whether in the classroom or outdoors, staff ensure that learning is always tailored to the children's needs. The support we offer all pupils, including those with additional needs, is recognised as a strength of the school. We have recently been awarded the Basic Skills Quality Mark as well as the Primary Science Quality Mark.

At Tarvin, we have a **strong commitment to**

languages and the arts. French is one of our greatest strengths and we are recognised by others for the very high standard our pupils achieve in this subject. A particular highlight is the biennial trip to Normandy for our older pupils.

We hold each year our stunning community exhibition which gives all of our children the opportunity to present their work to a real audience and brings the community together.

Music is strong; the children enjoy performing throughout the year and the Young Voices experience in Manchester is a highlight of the musical year for our junior children. Pupils also have the opportunity for private music lessons in school.

Each year, we stage two performances – the Infants are the stars at Christmas and the Juniors take to the stage each July. Recent productions of Joseph and Charlie and the Chocolate Factory were performed to a wonderfully high standard.

For our gifted junior artists, there is an opportunity to take part in an annual arts weekend in Wales alongside other schools.

Educational **Visits**





We place very high value on educational visits. As well as a range of day trips and visitors to school, Tarvin children attend a residential visit each year from Year 1.

Residentials include trips to France, Delamere, Beeston, Lancashire, Derbyshire, Llandudno and Anglesey. These develop the children's **confidence** and give them a range of experiences that would not be

possible in the classroom.





Some of our residential visits enable the children to work with children from other schools. One of the highlights of the French trip is the day we spend learning with the French children and visiting their school.

Most children at Tarvin go on to attend Tarporley High School. The visit to the Conway Centre, Anglesey, at the end of Year 6 is the pinnacle of the excellent transition process that is in place. Here, the pupils work in their new secondary tutor groups, getting to know teachers and making new friends.

Extra-Curricular Opportunities







The range of sports on offer at our school means that all children have a chance to get involved. Children compete in many sports across all ages and abilities. We track participation so children get lots of opportunity. Each year, well over 200 children represent us in competitive fixtures, most several times. This is close to 100% of children at our school. We want children to learn how to win and lose in the right way. We also have many house competitions running throughout the school year.

We also have between 15 and 20 clubs running each term across a range of areas, such as, sports, arts and crafts, music, computing, languages, chess, mindfulness and dance. We have just been awarded Games Mark Gold.

We are able to support working parents as we are lucky to have two on-site **before and after school providers**. Tarvin Pre-School




